Course Objectives:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Incorporate an OB/GYN assessment in general history for every woman 2. Perform a thorough OB/GYN exam as part of the general medical exam 3. Generate a problem list, formulate a diagnosis and management plan 4. Know the interactions of oral contraceptives and estrogen replacement with commonly used drugs, and know which drugs are teratogenic and which are contraindicated in pregnancy 5. Recognize the value of routine health surveillance as part of health promotion, including current screening guidelines for Pap smears, mammograms, blood pressure monitoring, bone density screening, colonoscopy, lipid screening, etc. 6. Know the current recommendations for immunizations in adult women and which are contraindicated in pregnancy 7. Demonstrate knowledge of contraceptive methods, sexually transmitted diseases, domestic violence screening, common psychiatric problems, menstrual cycle abnormalities, menopause, breast disease, and other conditions that affect women disproportionately 8. Demonstrate knowledge of the common surgical procedures performed on the Benign GYN service including laparoscopic, abdominal, and vaginal hysterectomies, salpingo-oophorectomy, hysteroscopy, diagnostic laparoscopy, and endometrial ablation, and be familiar with the anatomy encountered in each procedure
