Course Objectives:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Incorporate an OB/GYN assessment for every woman in the general history 2. Perform a thorough OB/GYN exam as part of the general medical exam 3. Generate a problem list, formulate a diagnosis and management plan 4. Know the interactions of oral contraceptives and hormone replacement with commonly used drugs; Know the risks, benefits, and contraindications to the use of oral contraceptives and hormone replacement 5. Recognize the value of routine health surveillance as part of health promotion, including current screening recommendations for PAP smears, mammograms, blood pressure monitoring, blood lipids, osteoporosis, etc. 6. Know the current recommendations for immunizations in adult women and which are contraindicated in pregnancy 7. Demonstrate knowledge of contraceptive methods, sexually transmitted diseases, domestic violence, common psychiatric problems, menstrual cycle abnormalities, menopause, breast disease, and other conditions that affect women disproportionately
